UCAS introduces initiatives to break down barriers for prospective applicants



UCAS has announced a package of initiatives aimed at students who may overlook university due to financial concerns or doubts about meeting entry requirements. The initiatives include scholarships, grants, or assistance to alleviate the financial burden for prospective students. Additional workshops, advice sessions and online resources could also be provided to help students understand entry requirements and the pathways to higher education more clearly. Read more here.

Leading universities opt for Maths Admissions Test



Durham University, London School of Economics and the University of Warwick are now using the multiple-choice Test of Mathematics for University Admission (TMUA) for 2025 entry, joining Imperial College London and the University of Cambridge. The test will be used for Mathematics, Statistics, Economics, Computer Science and Data Science courses. The test is part of a collaboration between Cambridge and Imperial College to simplify admissions for science, engineering, and mathematics-based degrees. Read more here.

Could job titles become a thing of the past?



Some firms are now shunning job titles in favour of skills, capabilities, and experiences to create greater transparency and agility within their workforces. This model of work, also referred to as holacracy, supports the concept of prioritising skills over jobs, embracing it as the new currency of work to create more transparency, autonomy, and agility. Apprenticeship Levy a waste of money says British Retail Consortium



Firms with a wage bill over £3m pay an Apprenticeship Levy of 0.5% of their annual payroll to a government fund to aid smaller firms to hire and train more young people. Retailers including John Lewis, Tesco, and M&S are now calling for a significant overhaul of the levy, calling it a "complete waste of money" and saying that it is an extra cost when firms are already grappling with increases to property bills and wages.
